I have been teaching high school English for three years after ten years teaching middle school. I have taught all four core subjects as well as drama, but most of my training and experience is as an English teacher. I am also a student. more opportunities the next day. And the day

after.....

I know from reading and writing with my students on a daily basis that consistency and choice build interest, engagement, and fluency. My students recognize that the more often they read and write, the more they build their own skills. They also know that these skills help them to critically navigate the world around them. We share the stories we've read from the bookshelves and then the stories we've lived from our hearts.
