



# Gracie's List

Dear friends,

When Gracie King arrived in her new middle school in 2014, she suggested that a gender and sexuality alliance (GSA) club should exist, but was told that it was not appropriate for middle school. This perplexed her. Not only did she know other LGBTQ+ youth in the school, but she also was a forward-thinker and believed everyone in her school should feel welcome and accepted. Her passion for social justice came from the books she read.

In high school, in 2016, in the same district, Gracie again found no GSA and was determined to start one. With the help of a teacher and other students, she did, and now that GSA is a thriving part of the school's community. Gracie always had a kind word for a stranger and a smile for anyone who needed one. She was known as a "Mom" figure to most of her friends. It was easy to not see Gracie's diagnosed depressive disorder and other psychological struggles because she hid them so well.

As Gracie's mental illness became more complicated, she read a lot about depression, anxiety, and other disorders to better understand her battle. Though she ultimately lost that battle, those books kept her engaged and talking about mental health. She was able to help friends who were going through things she had not experienced. She was able to stand up for LGBTQ+ students when others used microaggressions against them. She talked with friends about whiteness and racism. She was aware of the white supremacy and the patriarchy. She wanted to crush them. She also worked to crush mental illness stigma, LGBTQ+ inequity, and bullying—things she'd experienced firsthand.

Mostly, Gracie was encouraging. She loved and congratulated and cheered on her fellow humans because she understood what it was like to feel small, even though she was larger than life. In her last weeks with us, she had a brilliant idea to go to elementary schools and talk about emotions and how to feel them. She wanted to teach kids as young as kindergarten how to be emotionally compassionate, as she was.

The books on this list represent the types of books Gracie liked to read. Some were her favorites. Some she never read. We like to think of the list as a library she would have wanted next to her when her friends came to talk, or when she was looking for a read to help her understand the world. They are hugs, even if their subject matter is difficult. They are "I love you" written on a sticky note, stuck on your locker. They are a safe ear to listen. They start conversations about things that are important to the inner-self and the outside world.

Gracie's teachers would tell you—conversations are what Gracie did best. A friend of hers recently wrote, "She was the kind of kid who raised her hand as an announcement rather than a question." This list is our announcement in honor of Gracie. We are raising our hand. Let us start the compassionate conversations that need to be had in our changing and challenging world. Let us first open a book and locate the words.
